 - Intersectionality within our caucus
 - Cosponsoring with the women's studies caucus to talk about connection of queer and feminist studies – what is the role there?
 - Queering Kenneth Burke
 - Scholarship debates (Burkian perspective versus queer scholars)
 - Maybe it can be a “both, and” – take the topic and invite others (possible topics: transgender bathrooms – what's the difference?)
 - Milwaukee – Queer Center, maybe take a field trip there and partner with them for an event?
- Applied research – have scholars and community members meet up and discuss
- Increasing submissions

- This year's conference fell in March and over Spring Break so numbers are down in general
 - Submission deadline for next year is Oct. 9th
 - Target students in your gender and queer studies/sexuality classes and prepare projects for submission
- How transparent is our call for submissions? Let's make it clear exactly what we are looking for!
 - We are interested in the whole spectrum of the topic (sexual health, gender issues as well)
 - Reach out to instructors and CRTNET for them to share the call for submissions
 - Mass email to instructors and directors
- Queer Theory Master Class
 - Master class on Queer Studies
 - Think of who you might want to see speak on this
 - NOT your grandma's safe zone
 - Tony Adams & Jimmie Manning are potential possibilities for who could teach this
 - Queer of color critique literature and discussion
 - Intersection versus intersectionality
 - Draw in tech people
 - Queer video games/how gender and race work/are navigated in virtual spaces
