- Discussion panels that are outside the norm of paper panels; having a talkative audience helps bring in more voices. Much more organic discussion.
- We have a lack of minorities in the interest group, how do we bring in the silenced voices? How do you empower the silenced voice?
- How do you decolonize the conference?
- Local speakers
- An idea for a panel: st louis minority journalists; challenges of minority and media

- St. Louis/Ferguson at nearly 10 years: how the voices have changed; cross over with some other departments, journalists. Can we find a scholar who wrote something at the time and to revisit?
- Media portrayals. Global media systems and international cultures; indigenous peoples; Talking about Lewis and Clark and Sacagawea;
- St Louis community outreach; ideas about panels about literacy
- Media transitions broadcasting vs niche markets; streaming services vs free television
- Refugees; who is a silenced voice?
- Transitions are changing now because of covid
- *Networking session could be themed with transitions/graduate students, etc.*
